


Adapter Development Cycle

Oracle Life Sciences Data Hub Built-In Adapters





Creating Your Own Adapters

- There is no user interface in Oracle LSH for creating adapter; you must use the Application Programming Interface (API).
- After you have created an adapter it appears in the Oracle LSH user interface and you can assign user groups to it the same way you do for the predefined adapters;

- Application Area:
 - CDR_DF_APPLICATIONAREA()
- Work Area:

- Parameter:

Setting Up Security for Adapters

- Assigning User Groups to Adapter Domains and Adapter Areas on page
 - Assigning User Groups
 - Viewing and Modifying User Group Assignments
- Creating Roles with the Required Operations for Adapters
 The View operation on the following objects of subtype Default is required:
 - Adapter Domain
 - Adapter Area
 - Work Area
 - Program

Testing and Validation Considerations

- □ Checking in all objects is required and it may be useful for your internal testing and validation purposes to use this tool.
- The API that upgrades objects' validation status first checks in all objects and can be used to simplify that task.
- □ The validation API checks in and upgrades the validation status of the object you specify in the input parameter PI_VALOB, and all the objects it contains (if any).
- ☐ If you specify the Adapter Domain in PI_VALOB, the API attempts to check in and upgrade all the objects in your adapter.

API Name	Description
CDR_PUB_VL_ VALIDATION.UpdateValStatus	To set the validation status of all the objects in your Adapter Domain to Development, Quality Control, or Production, run the API



Testing and Validation Considerations

There is a different API for checking in each type of object

Following APIs are:

- CDR_PUB_DF_PROGRAM.CheckInProgramDefinition
- CDR_PUB_DF_PARAMETER_SET.CheckInParameterSetDefinition
- CDR_PUB_DF_TABLE.CheckIn

Note: - Each of these APIs has the same type of parameters



Testing and Validation Considerations

The following conditions prevent a successful validation:

- **1.** The validation of a particular object fails if the object is checked out by a user different from the person running the validation API. In this case, the person who has the object checked out must either explicitly check in the object or run the validation API.
- **2.** The validation process fails if the Work Area is included in the process (which it is if you have specified either the Adapter Domain, the Adapter Area, or the Work Area itself) and does not have a validation status of Production.

Use the API CDR_PUB_DF_WORKAREA.UpdateUsageIntent to change it to Production.



Critical decision points while working with Adapter

- When you upgrade to a new version of Oracle LSH or one of these external systems, you may need to upgrade the adapter also.
- Oracle LSH Release 2.1.3 has been tested ONLY on Release 11.5.10.2 of Oracle Applications.
- The Work Area, like other Oracle LSH Work Areas, must be installed in the database in order to function. Adapter Work Areas are installed as part of the post-installation.
- Oracle-technology adapters include all operations on Connections.
